

ANTHONY TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS

Regular Meeting
Wednesday March 6, 2019

The meeting was called to order by Richard R. Hess, Chair, at 7:00 P.M. In attendance were Supervisors Richard R. Hess, Dennis Sheatler and William Hartman. Roadmaster Frank Rishel, Solicitor Laurinda Voelcker and 7 visitors.

All motions are approved unanimously unless otherwise noted.

The Anthony Township Auditors opened their meeting and presented the minutes from their previous reorganization meeting, reported on their findings and presented the Financial Statement for the 2018 General, State and Community Center funds. Meeting was closed at 7:11 PM.

Richard Hess made a motion to approve the minutes of the February 6, 2019 monthly meeting. Second William Hartman.

Richard Hess made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report for February. Second Dennis Sheatler.

Richard Hess made a motion to approve payment of the bills for March. Second William Hartman.

Richard Hess made a motion to approve the work session minutes for February 26, 2019. Second Dennis Sheatler.

Old Business:

There were not zoning permits issued in February for Anthony Township.

Roadmaster Frank Rishel presented a report on the road work done in February.

Solicitor Voelcker reported on the Nonemaker issue.

Received equipment quotes from two local companies, Don Eyer Excavating, LLC and K. Dale Sellers General/Excavation Contractor. The sealed quotes were opened and read. Dennis Sheatler made a motion to award all five pieces of equipment to Sellers contracting. Grader \$105/hr.; Roller \$90/hr.; Excavator \$120/hr.; Dozer \$115/hr.; Dozer w/stone box \$175/hr. All equipment is with operator and has an (8) hour minimum per day. There will be no mobil or demobil charge on equipment used for more than (8) hours. Second William Hartman.

Opened and read the Stamm Road Grant Improvement Project bids. There were two contractors: Hammaker East, LTD in the amount of \$305,474.40; E.J. Brenneman, LLC in the amount of \$330,988.00. Bids were tabled until further information can be acquired.

New Business:

Richard Hess made a motion to put the following stone out for bid. 500 ton 1B stone; 1,200 ton 2B stone (#57); 250 ton #4 stone (Aashto #1); 500 ton Gabion; 500 ton 2RC modified; 3,800 ton 2A Subbase; 250 ton R5/R6 riprap; 1,000 ton R8 riprap. To be opened and awarded at the April 3, 2019 monthly meeting. Second Dennis Sheatler.

Richard Hess made a motion to approve letter to Senator Gordner and Representative Masser concerning the state police fee that Governor Wolfe is proposing. Second Dennis Sheatler.

Public Comment: Larry Flora asked if the township could draft a form letter concerning the police fines that can be handed out to the residents of the township to send to our representatives as well. Penny will take care of that and email it as well as have it available for people to pick up at the office.
