

## **ANTHONY TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS**

Work Session Meeting  
Tuesday August 28, 2018

The meeting was called to order by Richard Hess, Chair, at 6:00 P.M. In attendance were Supervisors Richard Hess, William Hartman, Dennis Sheatler, Roadmaster Frank Rishel, EMC George Dalykas and 1 visitor.

There was much discussion concerning the flooding that occurred throughout the township the week of August 14<sup>th</sup>. George Dalykas, Anthony Township's EMC and Julie Welliver reported on the flooding. They both stated that communication was not as good as it could have been and it is an area where we need improvement. Also, George was given pamphlets that will help residents know what steps to take in the event of an emergency. He handed these out to the residents who were affected by the flood. Extras are available at the township office. The board of Supervisors thanked both of them for their service to our community.

The Supervisors discussed compensating George Dalykas for his voluntary service to the township. George was in attendance and refused to receive any compensation of any kind. He stated that this is what he does for the community but thanked the board for offering.

A Declaration of Disaster Emergency was signed by the board of supervisors on 8/14/18 to declare an emergency situation in Anthony Township. This declaration allowed the township to take the necessary steps to move forward to complete work that was needed without the requirement of following the bidding process.

Reviewed the Emergence Assistance Policy #3 of 2007. No changes need to be made at this time.

Frank Rishel reported that the tentative date for tarring and chipping contract will be the end of next week.

Penny reported that the status on the bridge on Foggy Mountain Road is not known yet. Commissioners are waiting to see if they can get some financial help.

Penny was asked to call the county concerning the bridge inspection on Stamm Road. The county reported that the bridge is not owned by the county so they did not do an inspection on it.

Penny reported that the solar panels are not all functioning correctly. Nicholas Bolton from Third Sun Solar is coming this week to make the needed repairs.

Richard Hess discussed the decision that was made at the August 1, 2018 meeting concerning the location of the AED unit in the building during the off season of the pool. Richard Hess made a motion to rescind the previous motion and to make a new motion to place the unit in the kitchen in the cupboard above the oven for renters to use in the case of an emergency. Second Dennis Sheatler.

Penny reported that there is a grant available for up to \$5,000 from Central Susquehanna Community Foundation for flood damage and costs. The board asked Penny to find out more information and discuss it further at the September meeting.

Brandon Ball, Northumberland County mosquito-borne disease control program coordinator, has been in touch with Penny and set some traps here at the township building. Penny will report on the findings at the September meeting.

Request for payment for September was reviewed.

No public comment.

There being no further official business. Richard Hess made a motion to adjourn at 8:05 PM. Second Dennis Sheatler.
